According to the Bible, children are a...

Gift (*heritage*) – the Hebrew word for gift is “an assigned possession”

Reward – the Hebrew word for reward conveys a pleasurable sign of appreciation – children are not a burden or punishment

Arrows – Prepared (*Proverbs 22:6*) , Directed (*Psalm 51:5, Psalm 58:3, Proverbs 22:15*), Released (*Matthew 19:5*)

The 4 Phases of Biblical Parenting

Caregiver (your children rely on you for everything)

Cop (your children rely on you for boundaries)

Coach (your children rely on you for instruction)

Consultant (your children rely on you for requested advice)

Embrace the assignment

Enjoy the pleasure of legacy

Release towards the cross of Jesus

As the Perfect Parent

God desires to release you to his family, his purpose, his protection
