# For the parents of the Messiah (Joseph and Mary), home is constantly changing:

Nazareth to Bethlehem (Luke 2:3-7)

Bethlehem back to Nazareth (Luke 2:39-40)

Nazareth to Egypt (Matthew 2:13-14)

Egypt to Nazareth (Matthew 2:19-23)

## What can we learn from this transiency?

Home is where God is.

Home is being at rest where God has placed you.

Home is in your obedience.

#### Some Christmas obedience to help you find another way home:

Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen. – *Ephesians 4:29* 

If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone.

Now that you have purified yourselves by obeying the truth so that you have sincere love for each other, love one another deeply, from the heart. – 1 Peter 1:22

Do this...in remembrance of me. - 1 Corinthians 11:25
