

Part 6: The Stewardship of Praise

Mark 12:41-44

⁴¹ Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. ⁴² But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a fraction of a penny.

⁴³ Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "I tell you the truth, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. ⁴⁴ They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on."

Throughout the entire Bible, inner expressions are matched with outer expressions:

1. Lifting up our hands

I will praise you as long as I live, and in your name I will lift up my hands. – Psalm 63:4 (Psalm 134:2, 141:2; 1 Timothy 2:8)

2. Clapping our hands

Clap your hands all you nations... – Psalm 47:1

3. Playing of instruments

Praise the Lord with the harp; make music to him on the ten-stringed lyre... play skillfully, and shout for joy. – Psalm 33:2-3 (Psalm 150:3-5a)

4. Standing

Stand up and praise the Lord your God, who is from everlasting to everlasting. – Nehemiah 9:5 (2 Chronicles 5:12, Psalm 26:12)

5. Kneeling, bowing and prostration

Come, let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the Lord our Maker. – Psalm 95:6 (Revelation 19:4, Ephesians 3:14, Philippians 2:10-11, Nehemiah 8:6)

6. Singing

Sing praises to God, sing praises; sing praises to our King, sing praises.— Psalm 47:6 (Psalm 66:2, Acts 16:25)

7. Dancing and leaping

Let them praise his name with dancing. – Psalm 149:3 (Exodus 15:20-21, 2 Samuel 6:14-16, Psalm 30:11, 150:4, Acts 3:8)

8. Shouting

Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth. – Psalm 100:1 (Psalm 47:1, 66:1, 66:8, 95:1-2, 98:4)

Four things that get in the way of worshiping in a biblical way:

- 1. We don't know what the Bible says about it
- 2. We allow our pride to get in the way
- 3. We allow fear of what others might think to stop us
- 4. We have an incomplete view of tradition
