### The Ownership Truth

#### • Everything belongs to God

Yours, O LORD, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the majesty and the splendor, for everything in heaven and earth is yours. Yours, O LORD, is the kingdom; you are exalted as head over all. — 1 Chronicles 29:11

#### • Everything comes from God

Wealth and honor come from you; you are the ruler of all things. In your hands are strength and power to exalt and give strength to all. — 1 Chronicles 29:12

**Owner**                      A person who owns

**Steward**                    A person who manages another's property or financial affairs

**Biblical Steward** A child of God who aggressively manages and invests God's blessing for God's glory

5. I treated giving as a spiritual finish line and not a starting point.

But just as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in your love for us—see that you also excel in this grace of giving. I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others.
