1. The Assurance: I will be your friend "...I have called you friends..." – John 15:5

3. The Prayer

¹⁵ My prayer is not that you take them out of the world..."

²⁶ I have made you known to them, and will continue to make you known in order that the love you have for me may be in them and that I myself may be in them." – *John 17:15, 26*

God's Amazing Empathy

1. Temptation

For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet was without sin. — *Hebrews 4:15*

2. Social alienation

He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering. Like one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

— Isaiah 53:3

3. Physical suffering

 14 I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint. My heart has turned to wax; it has melted away within me.
 15 My strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; you lay me in the dust of death.
 16 Dogs have surrounded me; a band of evil men has encircled me, they have pierced my hands and my feet.

4. The sin of others

But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed.
