Abram's Call to Hit the Road

The LORD had said to Abram, "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you." — Genesis 12:1

Points of Interest: No map!

No direction!

No plan!

Abram's Response

So Abram left, as the LORD had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Haran. He took his wife Sarai, his nephew Lot, all the possessions they had accumulated and the people they had acquired in Haran, and they set out for the land of Canaan, and they arrived there. — Genesis 12:4-5

Obedience - "Abram left..."

Principle: In order to get where you want to go, you have to <u>leave</u> where you presently are.

<u>Trust</u> – "Abram was seventy five...He took his wife Sarah, his nephew Lot, all the possessions..."

Faith - "...and they set out..."

Moses' Call to Hit the Road

The LORD said, "I have indeed seen the misery of my people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out because of their slave drivers, and I am concerned about their suffering. So I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey—the home of the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites. And now the cry of the Israelites has reached me, and I have seen the way the Egyptians are oppressing them. So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt." — Exodus 3:7-10

Moses' Response

Lack of faith — But Moses said to God, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" — Exodus 3:11

Lack of <u>obedience</u> – Moses said to God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is His name?' Then what shall I tell them?" – *Exodus 3:13*

Lack of <u>trust</u> – Moses answered, "What if they do not believe me or listen to me and say, 'The Lord did not appear to you'?" – *Exodus 4:1*

Points of Interest: Moses' road trip lasted 40 years!

Moses repeated his dysfunctional cycle

over and over

Moses never arrived

Spiritual Road Trip Lessons

Obedience is the <u>first step</u> on any spiritual journey Trust addresses the <u>uncertainty</u> of the journey Faith <u>sustains</u> the faithful throughout the journey
