The Ninth Commandment

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. . - Exodus 20:19

The toxic lies that I have told myself:

- You are worthless.
- You will never get it right.
- If people knew the real you, they would hate you.

YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS...

My scriptural road to the truth:

The LORD detests lying lips, but he delights in men who are truthful. - Prov. 12:22

God wants me to <u>choose truth</u> – always.

Set a guard over my mouth, O LORD; keep watch over the door of my lips. – *Psalm 141:3*

I need to watch my mouth - always.

"Simply let your 'Yes' be 'Yes,' and your 'No,' 'No'; anything beyond this comes from the evil one. – *Matthew 5:37*

I need to be consistent in my answers and my promises.

The amazing truth God wants me to know:

- I am precious to God (Isaiah 62:3-5)
- My identity is grounded in Him (1 Corinthians 15:10)
- He knows me and He loves me (Colossians 3:12)

... AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOR

A gossip betrays a confidence; so avoid a man who talks too much. – Proverbs 20:19

Proverbs 26:20-26

²⁰ Without wood a fire goes out; without gossip a quarrel dies down.
²¹ As charcoal to embers and as wood to fire, so is a quarrelsome man for kindling strife.
²² The words of a gossip are like choice morsels; they go down to a man's inmost parts.
²³ Like a coating of glaze over earthenware are fervent lips with an evil heart.
²⁴ A malicious man disguises himself with his lips, but in his heart he harbors deceit.
²⁵ Though his speech is charming, do not believe him, for seven abominations fill his heart.
²⁶ His malice may be concealed by deception, but his wickedness will be exposed in the assembly.

Some practical application of the ninth commandment

- Ask yourself: Am I telling the truth?
- "Truth" your way out of tough situations.
- Ask yourself: Why am I talking to this person about that person?
- Refuse to gossip, and call it out when you see it happening.

My Decision

I will endeavor to tell the truth about my conduct and to reserve judgment about others until I know the facts. I refuse to engage in gossip that would hurt or wound another.

The Big Ten Challenge

I will commit to convene my most important small group (my family) once a week to discuss this week's commandment. We will discuss the commandment questions with honesty and truthfulness and close our time by praying for each other.
